Type II –

The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Essent US Holdings, Inc. (the “Parent”) and an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of Essent Group Ltd. (“Essent”), a Bermuda domiciled Holding Company. On November 5, 2013 Essent completed its initial public offering (“IPO”) of 22,666,635 shares of its common shares at a price to the public of \$17.00 per share. A total of 19,956,517 shares were sold by the Essent and a total of 2,710,118 shares were sold by certain selling shareholders, including The Goldman Sachs Group, Inc. (“Goldman Sachs”). Essent received net proceeds from the offering of approximately \$313.1 million, after deducting underwriting discounts and other estimated offering expenses. Essent did not receive any proceeds from the sale of shares by the selling shareholders. Subsequent to the IPO, Goldman Sachs Group owns approximately 7% of Essent.

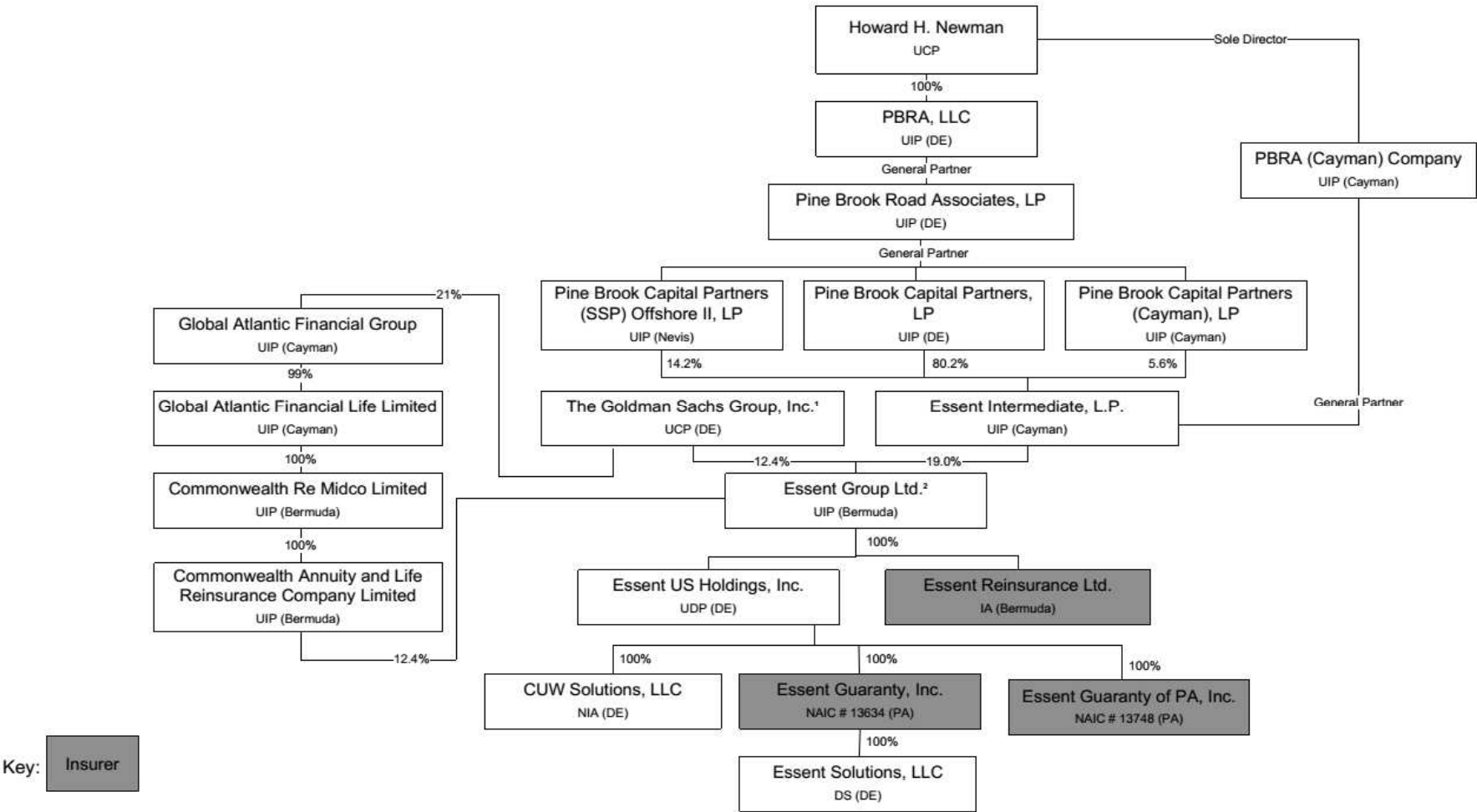

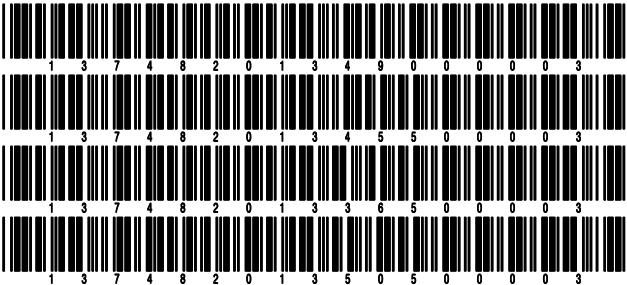
