- A. Reserves as of December 31, 2019 were \$851,615. For the period ended June 30, 2020, \$191,257 was paid for incurred claims and claim adjustment expenses attributable to insured events of prior years. Reserves remaining for prior years are now \$592,673 as a result of re-estimation of unpaid claims and claim adjustment expenses. Therefore, there has been a \$67,685 favorable prior-year development during the period of December 31, 2019 to June 30, 2020. The decrease is generally the result of ongoing analysis of recent loss development trends including the impact of previously identified defaults that cured. Original estimates are increased or decreased as additional information becomes known regarding individual claims. The Company does not adjust premiums based on past claim activity.
- B. Due to business restrictions, stay-at-home orders and travel restrictions initially implemented in March 2020 as a result of COVID-19, unemployment in the United States has increased significantly. As unemployment is one of the most common reasons for borrowers to default on their mortgage, the increase in unemployment has increased the number of delinquencies on the mortgages that we insure and has the potential to increase claim frequencies on defaults. As of June 30, 2020, insured loans in default totaled 38,068 and included 34,352 defaults classified as COVID-19 defaults. For borrowers that have the ability to begin to pay their mortgage at the end of the forbearance period, we expect that mortgage servicers will work with them to modify their loans at which time the mortgage will be removed from delinquency status. We believe that the forbearance process could have a favorable effect on the frequency of claims that we ultimately pay. Based on the forbearance programs in place and the credit characteristics of the COVID-19 defaulted loans, we expect the ultimate number of COVID-19-related defaults that result in claims will be less than our historical default-to-claim experience. Accordingly, we recorded a reserve equal to approximately 7% of the risk in force for the COVID-19 default notices received in the three months ended June 30, 2020, compared to approximately a 9% reserve estimate for defaults that had missed three payments or less as of December 31, 2019. The reserve for losses and LAE on COVID-19 defaults was \$0.9 million at June 30, 2020. It is reasonably possible that our estimate of the losses for the COVID-19 defaults could change in the near term as a result of the continued impact of the pandemic on the economic environment, the results of existing and future governmental programs designed to assist individuals and businesses impacted by the virus and the performance of the COVID-19 defaults in the forbearance programs. A 100 basis point increase or decrease in the reserve rate applied to COVID-19 new default notices would result in a corresponding increase or decrease in our reserve for loss and LAE of approximately \$125,000 as of June 30, 2020. The impact on our reserves in future periods will be dependent upon the amount of delinquent notices received from loan servicers, the performance of COVID-19 defaults and our expectations for the amount of ultimate losses on these delinquencies.

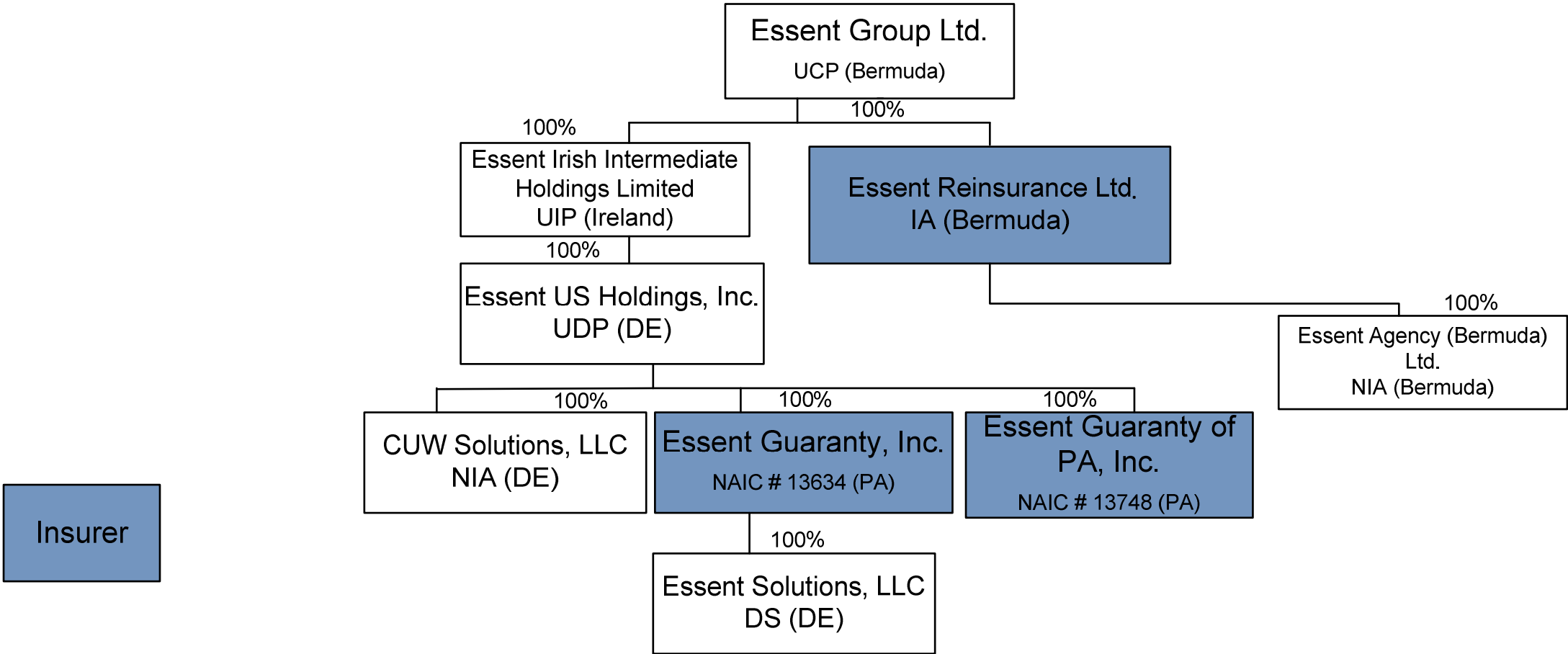

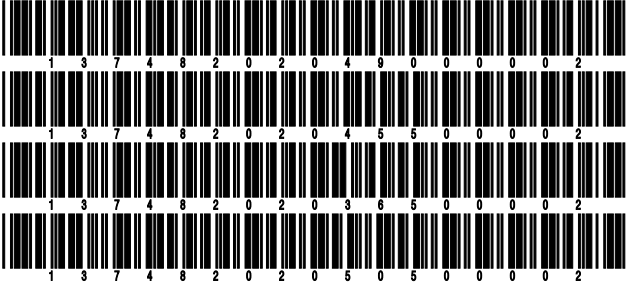
